Country Ham Project

It's time to sign up for the 2023 4-H Country Ham Project. Enclosed is the registration form. This is such a great project! Participating includes three trips to Clifty Farms in Scottsville late March to early August of 2023. All meetings are held on a weeknight at 6:00 p.m. and last approximately one hour. Transportation is on your own. The cost to participate is free for Simpson Co. youth thanks to the annual Ham Auction. If you choose to participate for free you keep one ham and 4-H gets one of the hams you cured. You may also pay \$20 to complete the project and keep both hams you cure. Adults and Cloverbuds (must be ages 5-8) may also participate for \$20 and you will receive one ham (the state only allows 4-H age youth to cure two hams). For 4-H members ages 9-18 in addition to the three curing trips to Clifty Farms you MUST also attend the KY State Fair on August 17 and give a 3-5 minute speech. Giving the speech is required to complete the project or you will not receive either ham cured. Each year Simpson County averages twenty participants in the ham project so I hope you will consider participating. The contract is due to the Simpson Co. Extension Office by Friday, December 13. 4-H Members Give Back...

One of the objectives of being in 4-H is for members to give back to our community! Simpson Co. 4-H wants to provide more opportunities for our 4-H families to do this so we are creating monthly 4-H Service Kits. These kits will change from month to month and will be limited in supply. For November we have baking kits available first come first served. Families simply stop by the Extension Office to pick up a kit. In the November kit is: a cake mix, can of pumpkin, baking liners, and a recipe for Chocolate Pumpkin Snack Cakes. All we ask in return is that you send me a photo or shoot me a quick email letting me know who the muffins went to on behalf of 4-HJ You can add your own label or handmade card if you'd like. Please remember if you pick up a kit it's expected you follow thru with the service project by the end of the month.
